John earned a B.A. in music from Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina and a Master of Church Music from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He has served as Minister of Music at several churches in the Baltimore area and continues to be involved playing keyboards of all sorts and singing. He also has a Master of Library Science degree from the University of Maryland, and currently serves as the Director of the Maryland State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled. He lives in Baltimore, Maryland with his wife Sherri, a hospice social worker. They have two children – Rhiannon, who is an historical performer at the Plimoth Patuxet Museum in Plymouth Massachusetts, and Sean, who is a doctoral student in mathematics at Johns Hopkins University.
